



Waipara Valley, South Island, New Zealand

The Torlesse Winery nestles in the heart of North Canterbury's Waipara Valley, a unique geographic area of New Zealand renowned for the range of wine grape varieties that can be successfully grown there.

The long, narrow Waipara valley provides an ideal climate which consistently yields a harvest of mature fruit in excellent condition.. It shelters in the lee of the Teviotdale hills, a trap for sun and open to the warming northwest winds that flow down from New Zealand's southern Alps during the summer growing season..



In autumn grapes in Waipara hang on the vines longer than in more northerly vineyards, ripening slowly and developing unique distinctive flavours.

Torlesse's wines consistently win Awards and their Waipara and Canterbury *Sauvignon Blanc*, *Riesling*, and *Pinot noir* are highly regarded and popular.

Selected sites in the Waipara Valley are also suited to the Bordeaux varieties of *Cabernet Sauvignon* and *Merlot*.

But it's our *Pinot Noir* that we are particularly excited about!

This grape variety only performs well when the *terroir* is right (that is - the climate, soils and the winegrowing philosophy are in harmony). Torlesse has Pinot Noir vineyards on three unique sites of the Waipara Valley, the valley floor, the river terrace and the north facing slopes.

Torlesse Wines takes its name from Charles Torlesse, an early Canterbury surveyor and farmer, at one time the largest landowner in North Canterbury and founder of the town of Rangiora. The Torlesse mountain range which rises on the western edge of the Canterbury Plains is also named after him.

All aspects of winemaking are carried out in Waipara by Torlesse. . Freshly harvested grapes are brought to the winery and crushed, then fermented as juice for the white wines, or on the skins for Pinot noir. The Pinot noir is then matured in oak barrels for about a year. Bottling also occurs on site, either with traditional cork closures, or the new screw cap closure that is designed to maintain the fresh, fruit-driven flavours.

The Torlesse Winery and tasting room is located in the heart of the Waipara region some 38 miles north of Christchurch on New Zealand's South Island. Torlesse wines are distributed through discerning wine outlets throughout New Zealand and exported to the USA, Canada, the UK, Europe and Asia.
